In re Holocaust Victim Assets Litigation

Certified Denial

to Claimant [REDACTED]

Claimed Account Owners: Josef Baer and Jenny Baer¹

Claim Number: 501494/RT

This Certified Denial is to the claim of [REDACTED] (the “Claimant”) to Swiss bank accounts potentially owned by the Claimant’s relatives, Josef (Joseph) Baer and Jenny Baer (Sulzbach) (the “Claimed Account Owners”).

All denials are published, but where a claimant has requested confidentiality, as in this case, the names of the claimant, any relatives of the claimant other than the account owner, and the bank have been redacted.

Information Provided by the Claimant

The Claimant submitted a claim stating that his father, Josef Baer, and his paternal aunt, Jenny Baer, were Jewish. The Claimant further stated that Josef Baer was the co-owner of a company named Jakob S. Hess. Furthermore a letter by the Claimant’s legal representative to the CRT dated 28 June 2005, which also contained attachments, indicates that Jenny Baer married [REDACTED] in 1899 and that the couple perished in a concentration camp in 1943.

The CRT’s Investigation

The CRT matched the names of Josef (Joseph) Baer and Jenny Baer (Sulzbach) to the names of all account owners in the Account History Database and identified accounts belonging to individuals whose names match, or are substantially similar to, the name of the Claimed Account Owners. In doing so, the CRT used advanced name matching systems and computer programs, and considered variations of names, including name variations provided by Yad Vashem, The Holocaust Martyrs’ and Heroes’ Remembrance Authority, in Jerusalem, Israel, to ensure that all possible name matches were identified. However, a close review of the relevant bank records indicated that the information contained therein was inconsistent with the information the Claimant provided regarding the Claimed Account Owners. Accordingly, the CRT was unable to conclude that any of these accounts belonged to the Claimed Account Owners.

¹ The Claimant should note that this determination relates only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owners stated above, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have submitted other claims.

The CRT's Analysis

Identification of the Account Owners

The list below contains names of account owners that match the names of the Claimed Account Owners and the reasons why the CRT has concluded that the Claimed Account Owners and an account owner are not the same person. If an account owner's place of residence was published, that place of residence is also listed.

Name: Joseph Baer (Germany)

Account Identification Number: 1009108

Specifically, the Claimant stated that his father, Josef Baer, was the co-owner of the company Jacob S. Hess. In contrast, the records show that the account owner's business had a different name.

Name: Jenny Baer

Account Identification Number: 1000035

Specifically, the Claimant stated that his aunt, Jenny Baer, was married to [REDACTED] between 1899 and 1943, when she perished. In contrast, the records indicate that the account owner was not married to an individual named [REDACTED] within that time.

The CRT has taken utmost care in matching the names of the person identified by the Claimant as a possible account owner to names of actual account owners identified in the Account History Database prepared pursuant to the investigation of the Independent Committee of Eminent Persons ("ICEP" or "ICEP Investigation"), which identified accounts probably or possibly belonging to Victims of Nazi Persecution, as defined in the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the "Rules"). The CRT has reviewed this claim carefully and analyzed matches to accounts belonging to account owners with alternative spellings of Josef Baer's and Jenny Baer's last name, which include Bär, and has determined that these accounts did not belong to the Claimed Account Owners.

The Claimant should note that all accounts awarded by the CRT are published upon release on the CRT's website at www.crt-ii.org.

Right of Appeal and Request for Reconsideration

Pursuant to Article 30 of the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the "Rules"), the Claimant may appeal this decision or submit a request for reconsideration within ninety (90) days of the date of the letter accompanying this decision.

An appeal must be based upon a plausible suggestion of error regarding the CRT's conclusions set out in this decision. Any appeals which are submitted without a plausible suggestion of error shall be summarily denied. A request for reconsideration must be based on new documentary evidence not previously presented to the CRT that, if considered, would have led to a different outcome of the claim. Claimants should briefly explain the relevance of the newly submitted documents in view of the conclusions stated in the certified decision.

If more than one account has been treated in this decision, the Claimant should identify the account, including, where available, the Account Identification Number, that forms the basis of the appeal and/or request for reconsideration.

Scope of the Denial

The CRT now considers the Claimant's claim to the accounts of Josef Baer and Jenny Baer closed. Please note that this decision applies only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owners identified herein, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have claimed accounts held by other persons or entities both in the Claim Number specified above and in other claims submitted to the CRT.

Certification of the Denial

The CRT certifies this Denial for approval by the Court.
