

# CLAIMS RESOLUTION TRIBUNAL

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In re Holocaust Victim Assets Litigation  
Case No. CV96-4849

## **Certified Denial**

to Claimant [REDACTED]

**Claimed Account Owners: Fritz Liebermann; Bedrich Feigl and Vilem Feigl<sup>1</sup>**

Claim Number: 205143/RT

This determination is based on the claim of [REDACTED] (the “Claimant”) to a Swiss bank account potentially owned by Fritz Liebermann, Bedrich Feigl, and Vilem Feigl. The CRT did not locate an account belonging to Vilem (Wilhelm) Feigl in the Account History Database prepared pursuant to the investigation of the Independent Committee of Eminent Persons (“ICEP” or “ICEP Investigation”), which identified accounts probably or possibly belonging to Victims of Nazi Persecution, as defined in the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the “Rules”).

This Certified Denial is to a Swiss bank account potentially owned by the Claimant’s relative, Bedrich Feigl and by Fritz Liebermann (the “Claimed Account Owner”).

All denials are published, but where a claimant has requested confidentiality, as in this case, the names of the claimant, any relatives of the claimant other than the account owner, and the bank have been redacted.

### **Information Provided by the Claimant**

The Claimant submitted a claim indicating that Bedrich and Vilem Feigl were brothers, that they were Jewish, and that together they owned a company called *Gebrüder Feigl* (Feigl Brothers), which was located in Prague, Czechoslovakia (now Czech Republic), where the brothers also resided. The Claimant stated that Bedrich Feigl and Fritz Liebermann opened a Swiss bank account on behalf of, or for the benefit of, Vilem Feigl, or *Gebrüder Feigl*. The Claimant did not provide any further information about Bedrich Feigl or Fritz Liebermann and did not identify Fritz Liebermann as his relative.

## **The CRT's Investigation**

The CRT matched the names of Bedrich Feigl and Fritz Liebermann to the names of all account owners and power of attorney holders in the Account History Database and identified accounts belonging to individuals, or over which individuals held power of attorney, whose names match, or are substantially similar to, the name of the Claimed Account Owners. In doing so, the CRT used advanced name matching systems and computer programs, and considered variations of names, including name variations provided by Yad Vashem, The Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes' Remembrance Authority, in Jerusalem, Israel, to ensure that all possible name matches were identified. However, a close review of the relevant bank records indicated that the information contained therein was inconsistent with the information the Claimant provided regarding the Claimed Account Owners. Accordingly, the CRT was unable to conclude that any of these accounts belonged to the Claimed Account Owners.

## **The CRT's Analysis**

### Identification of the Account Owners

The list below contains names of account owners and power of attorney holders that match the names of the Claimed Account Owners and the reasons why the CRT has concluded that the Claimed Account Owners and an account owner are not the same person. If an account owner's place of residence was published, that place of residence is also listed.

*Name: Fritz Liebermann (Prague, Czechoslovakia) Bedrich Feigl (power of attorney holder)*

*Account Identification Numbers: 5024148; 5029625*

*Specifically, the Claimant indicated that Fritz Liebermann and the Claimant's relative Bedrich Feigl opened a Swiss bank account on behalf of, or for the benefit for, Vilem Feigl, or his company. The CRT notes that the Claimant did not provide any information about Bedrich Feigl or Fritz Liebermann and did not identify Fritz Liebermann as a relative. In contrast, the records do not indicate that the account was opened by anyone else or to the benefit for anyone else but the account owner. In addition, the CRT notes that the Claimant did not identify the account owner as his relative, and that under Swiss law, a power of attorney holder is not considered to be the owner of an account. After a power of attorney holder dies, his or her powers in an account no longer exist, and they do not pass to his or her heirs. Therefore, even if the Claimant had identified a power of attorney holder, but not the account owner, as his relative, the Claimant would not have been entitled to the account unless there was evidence in the bank's records that the power of attorney holder and the account owner were related. The CRT finally notes that the Claimant did not identify the other power of attorney holders.*

### Right of Appeal and Request for Reconsideration

Pursuant to Article 30 of the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the “Rules”), the Claimant may appeal this decision or submit a request for reconsideration within ninety (90) days of the date of the letter accompanying this decision.

An appeal must be based upon a plausible suggestion of error regarding the CRT’s conclusions set out in this decision. Any appeals which are submitted without a plausible suggestion of error shall be summarily denied. A request for reconsideration must be based on new documentary evidence not previously presented to the CRT that, if considered, would have led to a different outcome of the claim. Claimants should briefly explain the relevance of the newly submitted documents in view of the conclusions stated in the certified decision.

If more than one account has been treated in this decision, the Claimant should identify the account, including, where available, the Account Identification Number, that forms the basis of the appeal and/or request for reconsideration.

### **Scope of the Denial**

The CRT now considers the Claimant’s claim to the accounts of Fritz Liebermann; Bedrich Feigl and Vilem Feigl closed. Please note that this decision applies only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owners identified herein, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have claimed accounts held by other persons or entities both in the Claim Number specified above and in other claims submitted to the CRT.

### **Certification of the Denial**

The CRT certifies this Denial for approval by the Court.
